

Concerns and Complaints

- Check that solutions have been implemented and are working, including feeding back to the person who raised the issue where appropriate
- Monitor and record concerns and complaints about student safety and wellbeing
- Meet our legal and ethical obligations.



SUBJECT: Notification of Animal Pest Control Using Vertebrate Toxicant As a school in the vicinity of the Hakarimata Scenic Reserve this letter is being sent out to inform you of an upcoming pest control operation within the Reserve. Stevenson Aggregates Ltd (Waingaro Quarry) are going to undertake animal pest control in the Hakarimata Reserve. In accordance with the Department of Conservation guidelines this letter is to notify you that we intend to undertake animal pest control using a vertebrate toxicant agent.

Details of the proposed operation are listed below:

Name of group:

Stevenson Aggregates Ltd [DOC estate]

Location of pest control operation (reserve/area, closest town/city):

Hakarimata Scenic Reserve (administered by the Department of conservation) Nearest suburb is Waingaro Road residential area, a suburb of Ngaruawahia

Operational area is the western slopes of the southern portion of Hakarimata Range.

Size of operation area:

107.6 Ha

Purpose of the control operation:

Control of rodents (rats in particular) and possums

Toxin(s) being used:

DOC estate - Cholecalciferol (Feracol) and Diphacinone (Ratabate and Pestoff 50D)

Method of toxin distribution: (i.e. bait stations/bait bags, spacing, application rate)

Bait stations and bait bags, at (approx 75m spacing). To be applied between 1st July 2024 and end of 30th June 2025.

Start date: 1st July 2024 Finish date: 30th June 2025 **Location of warning signs:**

Southern entrance of main Hakarimata walkway at Firewood Creek

Christian Youth Camp track entrance at CYC camp

Entrance to rail trail on Waingaro road

Junction of main ridge track and Waterworks track

Any other additional information/comments:

All affected landowners in which toxin is to be applied have been contacted and their written approval in principle obtained.


encl. Map of Operational Area Operation Factsheet
