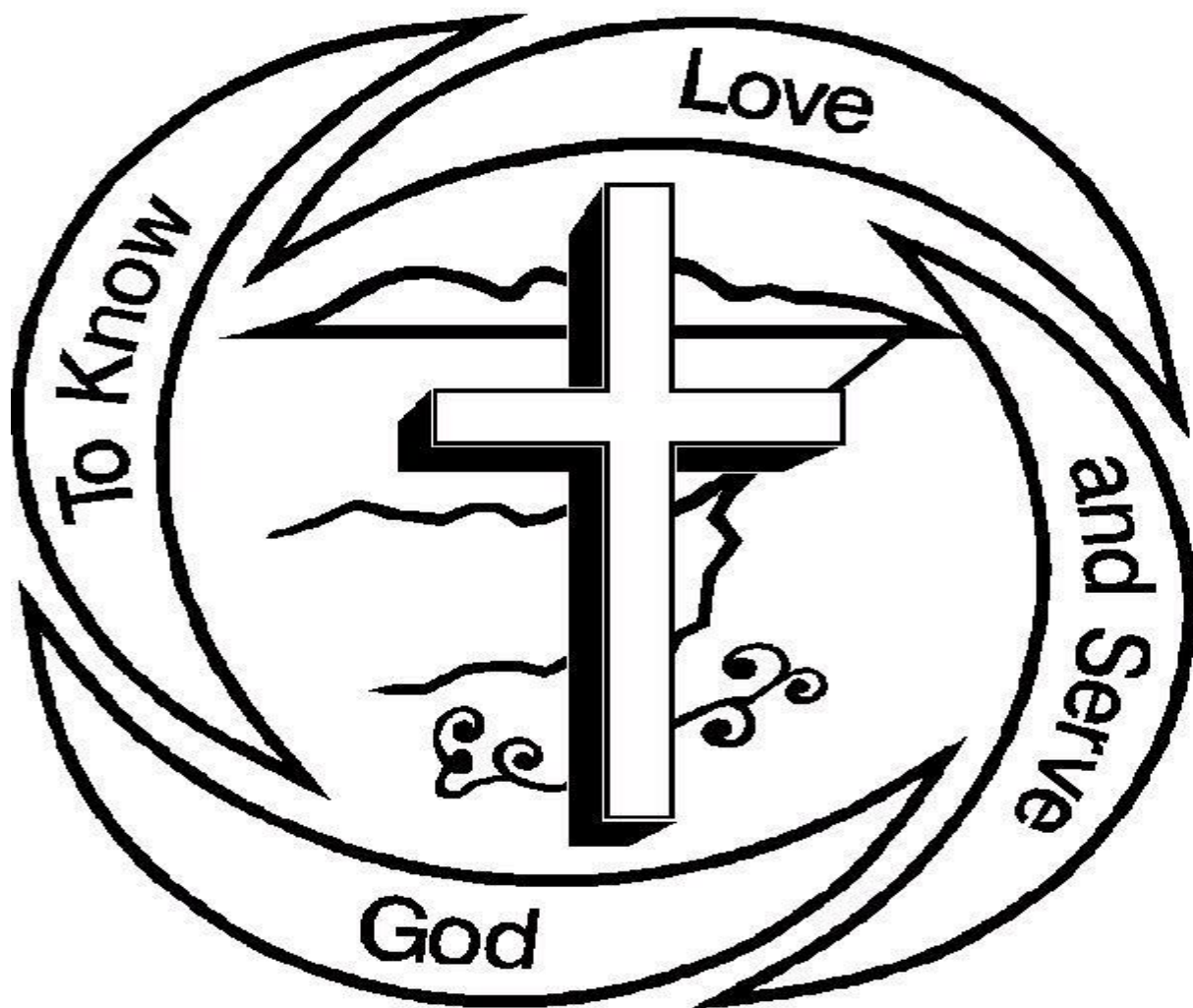

SECONDHAND UNIFORMS

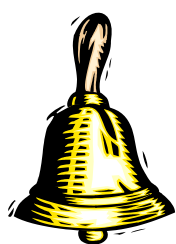
If you have any secondhand uniforms that you don’t need anymore, drop them off at the school office. Your help is much appreciated.
